OD Has a New website

Our new website is at the same URL: **oceandunesresortnc.com**. Your old bookmark should still work.

This takes you to a public site where the info is viewable by anyone *without a login*, and many of our documents are there. The **Members** tab provides a link to the existing Kuester website, which *does* require a login. A calendar, Meeting Minutes, Correspondence and Financial Reports – info we don't want available to the public -- are available on the Kuester website. This is the same site you currently access to view your personal account information.

The login/password is the same one you currently use for the Kuester website. If you do not have a login, you can register one from the login page. (You need your Ocean Dunes/Kuester 5-digit account # to create a login.)

Please be patient while we populate these two websites with all the information that was available on our old website.

What happened to the old website? It went byebye. The provider InstaPage was unhappy that Kuester wasn't pushing their communities to sign up and terminated our service. They were not interested in continuing our website as a separate account.

Why do we have a website? We do this to provide any easy way for owners to find information about Ocean Dunes, including documents that you would otherwise need to contact the office to obtain.

Incidentally, the new website is much cheaper than the old InstaPage website -- it costs only \$5 a month. (That \$5 pays to link it to our existing domain name.) We budgeted \$150 a month for the old website, so we are *saving* \$3480 over the next 2 years. The Kuester website is free, part of the CINC software that manages your account information. There is no webmaster cost to create/maintain the websites.

Surfrider Circle Parking

Over the next few weeks, for those who live in the 2200 and 2300 buildings, if you park in a marked space, as opposed to in a carport, it will be important to keep an eye out to make sure you are parking in the right spot. In order to keep the homeowners' cars from being bombarded by the trees (and their associated birds), we will be shuffling around some of the parking spaces. The current guest parking spaces will be moving back to the trees and several of the homeowners' spaces will move adjacent to the pool (where the guest spaces are, currently). The handicapped parking space will also move away from the fence to be closer to the pool. As the project comes together, we will email all those affected by the changes.

Hot Tub Repairs

The Ocean Dunes HOA has contracted Carolina Swim to repair the heater on the hot tub in the Rec Center pool area. The repair should be taking place in the next couple weeks so relief is on the way for those achy winter bones. Our contact at Carolina Swim is also generating a plan that we may choose to implement over the next several years to re-vamp the pool area at the Rec Center. It would include options to regulate heat and humidity in the pool area as well as state of the art pool chemistry and water quality controls to keep the pool water healthy. While it would be a long-term project, it is the type of project that will make the indoor pool area at the Rec Center a more modern,up-to-date amenity, increasing its value to the community, overall.

600 Building Update

Each month, we will do our best to update you on the progress of the 600 building repairs. The project is moving forward. We have insulated and winterized the building to the extent possible while still keeping it accessible to the contractors who need to have access to its framing. David Terkeltoub, our engineer, has completed his assessment of the building and its infrastructure problems, caused primarily by the powderpost beetle issue we had this past season. Several of the building's trusses have been damaged and will need to be replaced or modified. The engineering report will be presented to the HOA board of directors for their consideration and as soon as a decision has been reached, we will contact contractors to bid on the project, keeping quality work, reasonable pricing and an expeditious timetable at the top of our list of priorities.

2100 Building Renovation

The first phase of modifications to the 2100 building will be starting soon. As with many construction projects of this type, we will be starting at the top. We have contracted Highland Roofing Company to re-roof the building. This will take care of many of the water and leak issues homeowners have been experiencing. Along with the roofing project, Highland will be working to cap the chimneys on the 2100 building. It has been determined that inspecting and reconstructing the flues for each chimney in the building would be a huge burden on the homeowners so, in order to protect both the structure and the units, we will be closing off and capping the chimneys. This will keep water and, potentially, animals from getting into the chimneys. As was mentioned in the January newsletter, we are moving forward with creating the scope of work and getting construction bids for the bulk of the 2100 building renovations, which are still slated to commence in September of 2016.

A Fond Farewell

It is with great sadness that we must let you know that Dr. Bob Herrington passed away at the age of 84 on January 10, 2016. Bob was among the last of the original owners at Ocean Dunes. He and his wife, Joy, lived in unit 1001. Born into a military family in Galveston, Texas, Dr. Herrington lived in many places across the United States including

Washington, DC, California, Oregon, Spokane, WA and, of course, Kure Beach. He was a 1953 graduate of the Citadel in Charleston, SC and a 1957 graduate of the University of Washington School of Medicine in Seattle. After medical school, Dr. Herrington came to UNC as a pediatric resident from 1957 to 1959, followed by two years as a fellow in pediatric cardiology. In 1962, he left UNC to serve for four years in the U.S. Air Force. In 1966, upon completion of his military obligation, he returned to UNC for two years of additional fellowship training and subsequently joined the faculty in the Division of Pediatric Cardiology.

Over the next 25 years, Dr. Herrington was a respected member of the UNC Department of Pediatrics where he served as a Director of the outpatient pediatric clinics, established the interdisciplinary Birth Defects Clinic, and played a prominent role in developing and staffing pediatric cardiology outreach clinics across the state. He was a respected mentor and teacher who was twice awarded the medical school's Residency Teaching Award, and the annual Herrington Leadership Conference for pediatric residents was named for him in recognition of his teaching and leadership contributions. Perhaps most importantly, he was a faithful and passionate advocate for his many patients and their families.

A long-time member and servant of his church in Chapel Hill as well as a loyal philanthropist, Dr. Herrington will be lovingly remembered by his wife, Joy, his three children and five grandchildren, as well as so many of us here at Ocean Dunes who knew him for his amiable demeanor and mischievous sense of humor.

Optional Supplemental Spraying

On Tuesday, February 16, Allied Pest Control will be coming for their final supplemental spraying for the winter. This spraying is optional for the homeowners. If you would like to have your unit sprayed, the cost is \$25.00 and will be billed to your account. We will send out an email to the community in early February to remind homeowners about the spraying. Several of you are already on the list to have the service done. Allied will be back again in March to begin their monthly contracted spraying which is included as part of your homeowner dues.

Recipe of the month: French Onion Soup



Ingredients:

1/2 cup unsalted butter

2 tablespoons olive oil

4 cups sliced red onions

1 lbOnions (yellow/brown)

4 (10.5 ounce) cans beef broth

2 tablespoons dry sherry (optional)

1 teaspoon dried thyme

salt and pepper to taste

4 slices French bread

4 slices provolone cheese

2 slices Swiss cheese, diced

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Instructions:

- 1. Melt butter with olive oil in an 8-quart stock pot on medium heat. Add onions and continually stir until tender and translucent. Do not brown the onions.
- 2. Add beef broth, sherry and thyme. Season with salt and pepper, and simmer for 30 minutes.
- 3. Heat the oven broiler.
- 4. Ladle soup into oven-safe serving bowls and place one slice of bread on top of each (bread may be broken into pieces if you prefer). Layer each slice of bread with 1 slice of provolone, 1/2 slice diced Swiss and 1 tablespoon Parmesan cheese. Place bowls on cookie sheet and broil in the preheated oven until cheese bubbles and browns slightly.


