Cable Contract Renewed thru 2020

The Board of Directors approved the renewal of the existing Charter contract for expanded basic digital TV service through 2020 at a rate increase of 3% per year. They will drop our rate, immediately upon signing a new addendum, and freeze this rate through 2016. The new rate will be \$23.90 per unit, \$24.62 for 2017; \$25.35 for 2018; and \$26.11 for 2019. This is an immediate 17% reduction.

Regarding a little history, the contract with Comcast/Charter began in 2010. The bundled cable rate was \$34.99 per month/per unit with a 6% annual escalation. Beginning in 2013 the monthly rate per unit was, or would have been, \$41.67. In 2013, Gerrie Simpson renegotiated a \$26.50 per month/per unit rate with a 3% annual escalation. Our current cable rate is \$28.12 per month/per unit. It was scheduled to increase January 1 by 3% to \$28.99.

In 2010 the association signed a 'Right of Entry Agreement' lasting until 2020 which allowed CHARTER to run their cable lines from the street to our exterior cable boxes on the individual buildings. The association owns the interior building cables. The agreement states essentially that Charter has an exclusive right to use their exterior cable lines as well as our interior cable lines through the length of the agreement. That means the association is married to Charter until 2020 and cannot entertain competition, unless we invest in massive rewiring.

Bob Plazzo did investigate other service providers prior to receiving the information about Charter's exclusive right to our cable lines. Many companies do not provide service down here. DirecTV provided a bid, but they do not include basic broadcast channels (such as ABC) in their lineups.

Bob also looked at including Internet service to all units as part of the package, but Charter decided not to make that available. Owners are still able to set up individual agreements with Charter for such things as additional digital boxes (one is free with our contract), additional TV packages such as sports, and Internet service. Owners can also get Internet from other providers over DSL such as AT&T, and the pay-as-you-go Broadsail signal is available to most buildings.

Checklist for Vacating Unit

If you are closing up your unit for the season, please follow these guidelines:

- Run water in the sinks and tubs to fill the traps.
- Turn off water supply.
- Briefly turn on a faucet to relieve pressure in the water heater.
- Turn the water heater circuit breakers off
- Empty the refrigerator, turn it off, and prop the
- doors open to prevent mildew.
- Turn the heat on to a minimum of 60°, AC to a minimum of 85°.
- Put a little bleach in the toilets to prevent mildew.
- Unplug the TV, other electronics, toaster, coffee pot, etc.
- Disconnect the TV cable from the wall.

Parking Stickers are Here!

Finally – correctly numbered parking stickers are available at the Rec. Ctr., along with this year's recreation pass. If you cannot pick these up, we will mail them to you.

The parking sticker should be placed on your front windshield, driver's side, upper left. (Make sure you don't block your line of sight.) If everyone puts the sticker in the same place, it makes it easier to check for non-authorized cars.

All owner cars should have this sticker. If you need additional stickers, or have recently purchased a unit, please contact the office.

Recreation Equipment Available

If you want to use OD's tennis, basketball, or shuffleboard courts and don't have equipment, you can borrow racquets, balls, and shuffleboard accoutrements from the office. Just sign for them and return them in good condition. We also have some pool noodles that people have left behind that you can borrow.

Insurance Coverage Enhancements

If you rent out your condominium unit, there are some additional coverage enhancements you should look at in your insurance form.

- If your unit is insured as a business entity for your property and general liability coverages, your form is probably sufficient but you need to verify with your insurance agent the commercial handling "of your unit."
- If your unit is not insured as a business enterprise and you use the personal HO-6 format, there are some potential issues in your basic form:
 - 1. Property that is in a unit regularly rented or HELD FOR RENTAL to other parties by any insured is not covered.
 - 2. The peril of theft does not apply to a loss from a resident premises rented by an insured to a non-insured party.
 - 3. An HO-6 that is not endorsed excludes bodily injury and property damage in connection with a business but does allow limited coverage if the unit is rented on an OCCASIONAL basis. The term "occasional basis" is not usually specifically defined time-wise and therefore the insurance carrier might apply any interpretation.

To fill these gaps you should ask your agent to price and add the endorsement HO-1733 or its equivalent to your current HO-6 policy.

There are some other generic improvements that you should consider and discuss with your insurance agent. While the form numbers shown are the most commonly used, some insurance carriers use their own numbering system. The description shown should be enough to identify the endorsement for your agent.

These are:

- HO-0428 Limited Fungi, wet or dry rot, or bacteria coverage
- HO-0435 Loss Assessment coverage
- HO-0454 Earthquake Coverage
- HO-0490 Personal property replacement coverage
- HO-1731 special all risk personal property coverage
- HO-1732 special all risk dwelling coverage
- HO-XXXX if you have valuable personal property.

Discuss these with your agent and ask your agent for any other suggestions for further enhancements to protect your situation.

One final item: your insurance carrier places responsibility on you as a policyholder. Whenever there is a claim, your insurance carrier has provisions in the contract regarding prompt reporting of claims and it is important that you comply with these provisions. You do not want your carrier to make claim-adjusting difficult for you because of late reporting. You should notify your agent as soon as practical of any claim you may have, even if it may only constitute a minor part of the total adjustment. Your personal agent will handle it and thereby save you hassles in the future.

All of the above are recommendations. The ultimate decision as to what coverages and limits you have is your choice, with the advice of your agent.



<u>Recipe of the month:</u> Strawberry and Blueberry Icebox Cake



<u>Ingredients</u>

10 oz angel food cake, cut into 1-inch cubes* 2 pints strawberries, sliced 2 pints blueberries

For the cream filling:

6 tbsp fat-free sweetened condensed milk (I used Borden Eagle)

1 1/2 cups cold water

1 (4 oz) package white chocolate or cheesecake instant pudding mix

12 oz frozen whipped topping, thawed (I like TruWhip)




Directions:

Whisk the condensed milk and water in a bowl. Whisk in the pudding mix for 2 minutes. Let stand for 2 minutes or until soft-set; fold in the whipped topping.

Arrange half of the cake in the bottom of a 14-cup trifle dish. Sprinkle evenly with a layer of blueberries. Spread half of the cream mixture over the blueberries and gently spread (I piped it using a plastic bag and cut the corner off). Top with a layer of strawberries. Layer the remaining cake cubes on top of the strawberries, then add more blueberries and top with the remaining cream mixture. Finish with the remaining strawberries and blueberries, arranging them in a pretty pattern. Cover and refrigerate at least one 1 hour.
